Dear Friends

By the time you read this letter Reverend Judith will have retired. Her final service was at St. Andrew's Church, Compton Bishop on Sunday 11 July. A presentation of a bronze figure together with gift vouchers and a signed card were made to mark this special occasion and coffee and cakes were enjoyed by all. We do wish Judith a long and happy retirement in Wotton-under-Edge, where she can now enjoy being close to her family, spend time in her lovely garden and begin adventures, with her little dog Lewis, exploring places in the UK, which she has on her bucket list. We would also like to thank Judith for her kind and gentle shepherding during her time spent in Crook Peak.

This means that our Parish of six churches is now in vacancy (the time between one incumbent leaving and the next starting) and currently there is no indication of when Judith may be replaced. During the vacancy there will be a team of volunteers, to include our busy Churchwardens and myself (I work 4 hours a week usually on Wednesdays from 10.00 am to 2.00 pm) and we will endeavour to ensure a rota of regular services, together with Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals continue to take place throughout our Parish. All of our services will be led by a range of lay preachers, clergy from our Deanery and local retired clergy who continue to be licenced as PTOs (Permission to Officiate). We do have vacancies for Churchwardens at St Gregory's Church, Weare and we would welcome the offer of help in this role. The planning for our future is beginning to take shape. Notices of services will continue to be published in Contact, on the Parish Website (cookpeakparish.org.uk), on The Chancel App and displayed at our churches.

We are delighted to let you know that Bishop Ruth Worsley is visiting us on Sunday 12 September and will be leading our 10.30 am Common Worship Holy Communion Service at St Gregory's Church, Weare. We are also looking forward to welcoming the Venerable Anne Gell, Archdeacon of Wells who will be conducting a special service for the Rededication of the Bells at St Congar's Church, Badgworth on Sunday 24 October at 6.00 pm. The Archdeacon will visit us again on Sunday 28 November to lead our 10.30 am Common Worship Communion Service at St Andrew's Church, Compton Bishop.

We are in the process of setting up a RingCentral phone system for the Parish and it is intended that the main contact number for all initial enquires will continue to be Tel: 01934 733973 and the Email address for enquiries will remain as: crookpeakparish@hotmail.co.uk. Messages will be monitored regularly and responded to as soon as possible but please bear with us if there are slight delays. During the coming months, it is hoped that things will settle into a pattern/routine once the initial setting up and adjusting to our new situation has taken place. In the meantime, we would wish to offer our great support to the Churchwards and other volunteers who will be giving their spare time and helping towards a smooth transition. News from Weare School

Denise Mawdsley, Head teacher writes...

As another academic year draws to a close, our staff are busy writing the children's reports which makes us all reflect on the year we have had. I would like to thank the staff for the tremendous positivity and the flexibility they have shown when adapting to all the changes that Covid-19 has brought to the way schools have had to operate. Coupled with that we have had the added event of having builders on site as they work on our watertightness project. To date, the chimney on the old school has been re-pointed, the flat roof which covers most of the school has been removed, repaired, re-insulated and re-laid. The windows and doors are being replaced with highly efficient double glazing and finally the external walls will be reclad. The aim is that the work will be finished when we return to school in September.

The easing of some Covid restrictions has meant that we have been able to operate the school pool thanks to the tremendous effort of our PTA swimming pool committee. It has been a pleasure to watch the children enjoy their lessons in the pool, developing water confidence as well as their swimming skills. As we haven't been able to go any school trips this year, each class has held a special enrichment day. These have been based on a whole range of themes from learning about the Stone Age, the 2nd World War, the thrills of the traditional British seaside to a day packed with art, exploration and games linked to the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The children have been able to use the field and have enjoyed athletics coaching culminating in sports days (held in bubbles) as well as a swimming gala. A highlight was a surprise visit from an ice-cream van with treats for all, kindly funded by our PTA!

We look forward to welcoming our new Reception children into school when the new term starts in September. For many, this will mean a very small change as they are already familiar with the school site having attended our Rainbow Woods pre-school. For others there will be more changes, but our experienced staff are well-practised at smoothing transitions and are looking forward to getting to know our new families. This is also a time when we sadly say farewell to our Year 4 pupils as they move on to their next schools. They have spent time during the summer term on transition projects which we hope will help them to settle quickly and happily into their new schools in September. We will miss them but hope to welcome them back to Weare as soon as events such as our Christmas Fair and Summer Fun Evening can restart.

We would also like to thank Rev Judith for all the help and support she has shown to our school over the past few years, particularly for her visits to work with the children as well as her work in helping us develop our Christian Values which are now very much a part of our day to day school life. We would like to wish her well in her retirement.

I would like to wish everyone a lovely, sun-filled summer break as we work towards to the new school year in September.

> Jan Matthews writes... Hi Everyone! I am Jan, and I work at Secret World Wildlife Rescue at East Huntspill. We take in injured and orphaned wild birds and animals and provide the care that they need until they are ready for release back into the wild. The birds that we rescue vary from small birds such as robins, blackbirds and blue tits up to larger ones such as jackdaws, crows, pigeons, kestrels and swans. Rescued animals include deer, badgers and badger cubs, foxes and fox cubs, hedgehogs, weasels, mice, otters, rabbits and hares. Animals are returned for release as near to the place that they were originally found as is possible.

> Secret World's phone number is 01278-783250 and they are open 8am to 8pm every day of the year. There is a night service called Wildlife & Badger Careline which runs from 8pm to 8am. Their number is 07954-036687. The daytime number (above) routes the caller to this number at night on their answering service. It is good to have both numbers on your phone so that you can call for help if you find a bird or animal in trouble at any time. I have been with Pauline Cini at The Firs, Upper Weare, for a while. She has kindly let me put up an aviary for the baby birds that I have orphan-reared (robins and starlings this year so far). They are usually still in the nest when they are brought in, and they are kept with their siblings (if any have ready to start spreading their wings. They then go into a large cage where they continue to be hand-fed until they can feed themselves from the food provided for them. The next phase is to move them into the aviary to adjust to the outside world and, after five days, the aviary door is opened, and they are free to start their big adventure into the Great Outdoors. They have no parents to teach them how and where to forage and so food is left in the open aviary for them to come and go. Please make a note of both phone numbers to help our wildlife. Thank you, Jan.

Observations from a member of Judith's Flock

Many of you will know that Reverend Judith and Lewis have now retired from Crook Peak and are settled into their new home in Wotton-under-Edge. Judith has been the Rector of Crook Peak Parish for the past five and half years. This note hopefully serves to summarise Judith's time with us, although I know many of you will have other memories and stories to tell. For example, being snowed in at Lee Abbey on one occasion!

During her time with us Judith has led many regular services at our six churches. Her ministry has also included baptisms, weddings, funerals and pastoral visits and those of you who have got to know her through these very personal occasions will have witnessed first-hand her gentle and caring approach to all that she does.

She has experienced some personal challenges whilst with us, including periods of poor health. These have always been met with determination and a continued professional approach with no thought of giving up. As a part time Rector for six churches there have been many demands made on Judith and she has worked hard to meet the needs of her flock, frequently working on her days off to be flexible. COVID-19 and the subsequent lockdowns, as with us all, have come with their challenges for her too. She was personally told to isolate due to her health vulnerability. Throughout this time, she spent many months on her own at the Rectory without being able to see her family and I know she found this particularly hard. Friends and neighbours helped with bringing her provisions, along with supermarket deliveries. While in her isolation Judith and her support team worked hard to bring weekly services to our homes via YouTube. There was a bit of a learning curve for everyone recording and broadcasting these videos!

However, this certainly kept her busy and probably helped her retain her sanity and sense of humour. Once out of lockdown and rapidly approaching her retirement date, there were many matters to attend to regarding COVID requirements, risk assessments, sanitising of churches, implementing safer procedures, monitoring of visitors and rearranging postponed events - the list is endless.

Judith recently officially reopened the Church Room at Weare. A very keen team of people have worked tirelessly raising money and procuring grants for this project and they have now managed to transform this dear little room. It is ready and waiting for people to hire for small gatherings and functions. During the refurbishment Judith could be found there on a regular basis, sanding and painting anything and everything in sight, along with scrubbing, cleaning and repairing many items.

The ongoing restrictions have also meant that her preparations for retirement were somewhat different to what she anticipated. She has worked hard to tie up the loose ends, trying to ensure that the various aspects of her work will be left in safe hands. In amongst this, she has been gradually moving from the Rectory to her new home. I was reminded of her in a recent sermon when she spoke of going into the world uncluttered. Judith has most certainly achieved this with almost daily trips to charity shops and the council tip, together with frequent collections of furniture, etc. by the British Heart Foundation along with many items given away to friends and family. It will feel sad with the Rectory empty, waiting and hoping for a new incumbent to breathe life into it once more.

I am sure that Judith will miss her ministry and after a period of rest and reflection from her recent busy months, she will feel ready to return to her passion and continue to work with God. They say you don't appreciate what you have until it's gone. I'm sure this will be how we feel without Judith.

Thank you, Judith, for the time you have spent with us here in Crook Peak and do enjoy the next chapter of your life's journey with good health, happiness and laughter. We will miss you greatly!
